The Australian Warning System.



ADVICE

Advice means an incident has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes.



WATCH & ACT

Watch and Act means there is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to start acting now to protect you and your loved ones.



EMERGENCY WARNING

Emergency Warning means you may be in danger and need to act immediately.



Emergency Alert

During an emergency, you may receive a warning from the number: 0444 444 444.

Any information received from this number

is genuine and you should take action.



Keep informed, and follow directions from Emergency Services

In the ACT, the ACT Emergency Services Agency is the single point of truth for emergency information.

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Are you **Bushfire Ready?**

The ACT Rural Fire Service (ACTRFS) encourages the community to take simple steps to be prepared for the threat of bushfire.

Are you at risk?

Bushfires have long been a part of the ACT landscape. Flammable vegetation, long hot summers and periodic drought have regularly combined to produce bushfires and varying size and intensity.

This means bushfires are an inevitable fact of life in the ACT, no matter where you live.

Bushfires can happen guickly and without warning.

Weather conditions and fuel loads can help emergency services predict the severity of a fire, but not the likelihood of one starting.

It's a fact that if you and your family are well prepared, you stand a better chance of surviving an emergency.

Ensure you have a buffer surrounding your ensure home, free from flammable materials.





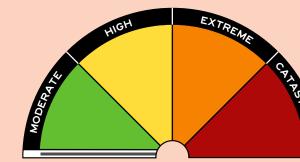
INSURANCE

Fire Danger Ratings provide an indication of the consequences of a fire, if a fire was to start.



CLEAR GUTTERS

Dry leaf matter in gutters can allow a fire to spread to the property.

REMOVE AND SECURE

Store firewood and other flammable materials like mulch away from your property.
