Thursday 5 March- 6.3 'Stay or Go Policy'.

"Conrad Barr to investigate opening and advising the public of evacuation centres on days of extreme fire danger".

Conrad Barr provided advice in relation to the ACT Recovery Plan and the ability to request the establishment of an evacuation centre or centres. A recent example was the opening of an evacuation centre following a fire involving an acetylene cylinder in south Canberra.

Thursday 5th March Public Warning Information.

Council recommends that ESA consult with the Bureau of Meteorology to develop a campaign to heighten the public's awareness of Bushfire Danger on specific fire danger days. BFC recommends educating the public about what the fire danger indices mean, and what these mean on any given day during the Bush Fire Season. Council believes there is a strong need to focus more education on the fire danger rating and what this indicates, particularly directed towards the younger generation. Council have suggested that fire danger index numbers be printed above each rating on public warning signs.

ACTION: Commissioner to report back to Council the feasibility of this initiative. Council see benefit in ensuring a co-ordinated approach across all jurisdictions.

SUBJECT:	Presentation on Strategic Bushfire Management Plan V2 –	

An exposure version of the draft SBMP V2 has been placed on the ESA web site and community consultation has commenced.

Nick Lhuede and Virginia Dixon will advised Council of this process and proposed timeframes for consultation and the final production of SBMP 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

An exposure draft of SBMP was realised in late April 2009. A process of targeted consultation has been implemented with rural land holders. There will be 3 rural based and 2 urban based consultation sessions. The urban meetings will concentrate more on delivery of information and will be conducted by officers from ESA, ACTFB and TAMS.

A formal and final draft of the plan will be developed by August 2009. Following the release of the final draft there will be a 15 day period for public comment. Comments will be reviewed after 30 days, followed by the draft being submitted to cabinet. Once approved it should be formally signed off by government.

SUBJECT:	Council discussion and finalisation of the Bob Smith Report and advice to the Minister

Bob Smith provided a final draft version of his report into the recommendations of the McLeod and Doogan Enquiries into the 2003 Canberra Bushfires. Council at its last meeting agreed to undertake some final amendments and to finalise its report to the Minister at the May meeting.

CURRENT SITUATION:

A number of members have undertaken reviews and amendments and the final document was discussed and agreed to by BFC at the May meeting. An approach on how this will be presented to the Minister, advice regarding the document, and forward actions that will need to be undertaken, were discussed at the meeting.

SUBJECT:	Council discussion on Media Presentation by ESA

In February 2009 the Chairman had some discussion and correspondence between the Chief Officer and the Commissioner regarding the ESA spokesman for media related Rural Fire Service matters.

CURRENT SITUATION:

The Commissioner provided a response to the Chairman regarding this issue. The Chairman would like to raise the matter with Council members and seek their opinions and recommendations regarding future media representation of RFS business.

RECOMMENDATION:

Gregor Manson explained the importance of appointing a suitable representative to talk to the media as they represent the whole ACT Emergency Services Agency. GM encourages using one 'Media Front Man' as it creates continuity in the public eye and maintains good working relations and contact with media personnel. If a situation requires a technical explanation or it is appropriate for one of the service personnel to address the media then this is also OK. A single media contact also limits the disruption to the Incident Controller who needs to concentrate on managing and dealing with the incident.

Council supports Gregor's current 'Media Front Man' arrangements, they believe that the public do look for and recognise a familiar face in which they can develop trust. CG: This approach should focus on more than Incidents, she believes somebody should become an identified face for ESA broader issues such as SBMP2. CP: Believes it is valuable in having people involved in the incidents addressing the media. KJ: Considers that sometimes a change in personnel can also create more desired interest from the public.

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7.1 Brian Parry's Replacement

Council have formed a sub- group to comment on the effectiveness of the current ESA structure in the light of Brian Parry's resignation as Deputy Commissioner. BFC indicated risks associated with the current structure, and that in the event of a major bushfire the structure does not currently provide sufficient depth of leadership across the agency. Council believes that tensions between the land managers (TAMS) and RFS are affecting the cohesion between the services. Council have taken the view that everybody needs to work as one integrated team and their view is that a replacement should be someone who can enhance integration of the services within the ESA structure. The services need to operate under their own Chief Officer and coordination undertaken by an operational Deputy Commissioner to ensure integrated incident management.

RESOLUTION &/OR DECISION:

Gregor Manson (ESA Commissioner) has spoken to the Deputy Chief Officers of each of the 4 services to better understand perceptions and issues with the current structure. Gregor Manson (ESA Commissioner) is interested in hearing feedback on this issue and looks forward to a formal response, expressing the concerns and recommendations of Council.
